

## Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) – 2018

### OVERVIEW

#### The Programme

The Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) is the examination held in order to gain admission into one of the nineteen National Law Universities in India. It is an all-India common entrance examination and is conducted at centers across the country.

### REQUIREMENTS

#### Eligibility

1. There is no upper age limit for admission into the UG programme in CLAT 2018.
2. Candidates belonging to Unreserved/OBC/Specially abled categories must have secured a minimum aggregate of 45% in their 10+2 qualifying examination.
3. Candidates belonging to the SC/ST categories must have secured a minimum aggregate of 40% in their 10+2 qualifying examination.
4. Candidates appearing for their qualifying examination in March/April 2018 are also eligible to apply. They will be required to produce evidence of their passing at the time of admission.

### ADDITIONAL DETAILS

#### Important Information

1. The CLAT 2018 will have a maximum of 200 marks and will be 2 hours long. It will be composed of 200 multiple-choice questions and there will be negative marking of 0.25 for each wrong answer.
2. The subject areas of the CLAT 2018 will be English, General Knowledge and Current Affairs, Mathematics, Legal Aptitude and Logical Reasoning.
